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Eagles Pro Football Player and Former Saint Malcolm Jenkins Keynotes College Track New Orleans' 5th Launch To College Ceremony

The Malcolm Jenkins Foundation awarded scholarships to college-bound seniors

New Orleans, LA, Thursday, May 12 – Today, Eagles Pro Football Player (former Saints) and College Track New Orleans Local Advisory Board Member Malcolm Jenkins served as the keynote speaker for the Organization's 5th Launch To College Ceremony held Thursday, May 12, 2016 in the Professional Schools Building at Dillard University. Jenkins' message inspired the 44 2016 College Track New Orleans Scholars from over 15 high schools in the New Orleans metro area, their families, and other invited guests.

Through The Malcolm Jenkins Foundation's Project REWARDS Program, area high school students are provided a four-year life skills curriculum as well as the opportunity to earn college scholarships. Being one of College Track New Orleans longest supporters, Mr. Jenkins serving as this year's keynote is even more special, as the Organization will have its first cohort of students graduating college this spring, many of whom received scholarships from The Malcolm Jenkins Foundation.





In 2012, The Malcolm Jenkins Scholars included ten (10) recipients, of which four (4) are graduating this spring: Troy Simon (Bard College), Irene Beauvais (Howard University), Briana Brown (Southeastern Louisiana University) and Jessica Irons (Goucher College). Simon delivered an empowering speech about his commitment to education and expressed his thanks to The Malcolm Jenkins Foundation and College Track New Orleans for their continued support. He will attend Yale University this fall for graduate school.

College-bound seniors who completed Project REWARDS were eligible to apply for scholarships. To date, \$85,000 in Scholarships have been awarded from The Malcolm Jenkins Foundation to 56 graduating high school seniors, of which 60% (34) are first generation college students.

"Our youth today should have every opportunity available to them to excel and achieve," says Jenkins. "I am thrilled to be here today to honor our TMJF Scholars who are now college graduates as well as award 13 high school seniors with scholarships who have completed the College Track and Project R.E.W.A.R.D.S. curriculum."
